


















Summer bingo!

<p>Bookmarks</p>  <p>Cut shapes from card or paper, paint them and decorate with stickers, wash tape or a string threaded with beads.</p>	<p>Paint on fabric</p>  <p>Decorate fabric napkins, tote bags or old T-shirts using fabric crayons or fabric pens.</p>	<p>Nature picture</p>  <p>Collect leaves, flowers, grass and sticks, then create pictures, mandalas or figures directly on the ground or glue them onto paper.</p>	<p>Fold Origami</p>  <p>Create sailing boats, a jumping frog or flowers in different colours.</p>	<p>Clay magnets</p>  <p>Shape small figures and attach magnets to the back once they have dried.</p>
<p>Paint flower pots</p>  <p>Decorate terracotta pots with acrylic paint or acrylic paint pens. Afterwards, you can plant something in your pot!</p>	<p>Portrait painting</p>  <p>Paint portraits of each other on paper using watercolour paints or gouache.</p>	<p>Make a garland</p>  <p>Cut bunting flags from fabric, decorate them with fabric paint or fabric pens and attach them to a string. Hang them between trees, chairs or along a fence.</p>	<p>Sticker worlds</p>  <p>Create sticker worlds in a blank notebook</p>	<p>Draw a daily highlight</p>  <p>A lovely way to reflect together, and fun to keep as a summer journal.</p>
<p>Bark boats</p>  <p>Carve or break small boats from bark, add a stick as a mast and let them sail away in a stream or lake.</p>	<p>DIY memory</p>  <p>Draw simple pictures twice (a sun, a hat, a cat, a flower and so on) and cut them out as cards. Once all the pairs are ready, you can play together!</p>	<p>Print on fabric</p>  <p>Carve simple shapes into potatoes or use real flowers. Dip them in fabric paint and print patterns onto fabric napkins, tote bags or old T-shirts.</p>	<p>Air-dry clay</p>  <p>Shape decorations or signs. Insert wooden skewers before the clay dries so you can place them in flower beds as decorations.</p>	<p>Nature collage</p>  <p>Press the leaves and flowers you find and use them to create bookmarks, cards or framed pictures.</p>
<p>Clay jewellery</p>  <p>Make necklaces, bracelets or rings in your favourite colours.</p>	<p>Make paint from nature</p>  <p>Crush blueberries, dandelions, grass and anything else you find, then use the colours to paint with!</p>	<p>DIY postcards</p>  <p>Create personalised postcards that will be even more fun to send once you arrive.</p>	<p>Decoupage</p>  <p>Use pressed leaves or flowers and attach them with decoupage glue to glass jars, tin cans or card. Turn them into lanterns or other decorative creations.</p>	<p>Paint with one colour</p>  <p>Choose a colour each and paint using different shades or mixes. See how much variety you can create within a single colour palette.</p>
<p>Nature colour wheel</p>  <p>Draw a circle divided into different colour sections and try to find something in nature that matches each colour. Photograph or glue down your finds.</p>	<p>Activity book</p>  <p>Easy to pack and provides hours of entertainment, but don't forget the pens!</p>	<p>Paint on glass</p>  <p>Decorate old glass jars, mugs or plates with porcelain pens or glass paint. Bake them in the oven if you'd like the design to be more durable.</p>	<p>Splatter painting</p>  <p>Dip a paintbrush or toothbrush into paint and splatter it across your paper outdoors.</p>	<p>Tie-Dye on fabric</p>  <p>Tie elastic bands around T-shirts, fabric napkins or duvet covers and dye them with fabric dye. Unique, summery and always exciting to reveal the final result.</p>
